
IMAGES OF ST ALBANS KON HAUMANN COLLECTION

Konrad "Kon" Haumann March 1936 – December 2018



Kon Haumann's family were German refugees who came to St Albans in 1954 and settled into a bungalow in Alfrieda Street. His parents were George and Madalena Huamann, his twin brother was Joe, and his younger brother was Gerry.

George Haumann with his older sons Kon and Joe worked with the Victorian Railways while they built three homes along Alfrieda Street in St Albans.

Soon after arriving, Kon started taking photos of the local houses, streets, and family and friends. His images record the development of a neighbourhood responding to Australia's post-WW2 refugee resettlement program, and are especially important as St Albans became one of the most multicultural districts in Melbourne if not in all of Australia. St Albans became a popular destination for home builders because they could build a small bungalow and live there as they built the rest of their home.

Kon later worked at Taubmans and was selling real estate in the 1960s before starting his own business as a painter, initially with his brother and then independently. In 1964 he married fellow émigré and St Albans resident Marianne Gampe, and they raised three daughters from their Alfrieda Street home.

Kon joined the St Albans Community Youth Club during the 1950s and ended up running their table tennis activities for the next 60 years. During this time he was also active with the Sunshine and District Table Tennis Association, becoming their oldest and most respected life member.

Kon retired from his community activities in 2016 at age 78 years, a true "new Australian" and St Albans resident for over 60 years.

Marianne Haumann nee Gampe died in December 2008.

Kon Haumann passed away in December 2018.






































